Support ROBE

The PV Homes Association Board has been self-perpetuating. Board members select who fills vacancies and nominate themselves for election. Residents have had no real choice in the process. Many assume that the homes association is protecting the parkland. They are wrong. The association actually sold parkland to a private citizen. When the court ruled that the association had exceeded its authority, acted illegally, and that the sale had to be reversed, the association appealed. If they win the appeal, then all the parkland could be for sale. The association also supported and agreed to help fund a proposal that would have helped a few residents at the expense of more parkland and a popular hiking trail.
